(Draft) **Observations**

- We have to consider the gap between active, educated refugees and less educated people who are not active. (we see the same situation in the Netherlands). The group less educated refugees is isolated and has no networks as educated refugees have ('new neighbours').
- Our cooperation strategies have to be inclusive, to find methods to realise that. A buddy system can contribute to solve the gap
- Inclusive cooperation strategies (ICS) have to focus on two levels (2 x D) to be inclusive. 1. Development (own knowledge, skills, Dutch language, etc.), and 2. Direction (what is the purpose of development). Each refugee has to have a personal 2 x D card. Within supportive bottom-up 2 x D workshop participants can exchange experience and learn
- ICS can be focused on the togetherness of active new neighbours and old neighbours, to form a team or committee to organize a concrete project/manifestation (like September 3, Mijn wijk, jouw wijk) with a preparation and monitoring component.
- Food/catering can be a concrete project like the catering team at Einstein Project, supported by Kim van Laar. Four nationalities (not only refugees) are coming together within a self governing team. The dinner on May 24 was partly a product of this catering team.
Catering is an easy and profitable way of cooperative working.
- How to create a network of informal meeting points like Voorkamer where new and old neighbours can meet each other and drink and eat somewhat? Is this an issue?
